Snapchat

It has come to our attention that a disturbing case of child abuse has been recorded and shared on Snapchat. News of this has spread so far and wide that unfortunately students of this school have both heard about it and seen the video.

Due to the nature of the content, viewers are quite rightly disgusted and angry but it is very important this video is not shared via their stories as this constitutes a criminal offence.

Anybody known to be reposting the video will be reported to the Police as a matter of urgency.

Parents, please can you:

- ask your daughter if they have Snapchat?
- ask them if they can show you their stories? (*they are public so this shouldn't be a problem*)
- ask them to immediately report any inappropriate content should they see it.

Parents, please can you:

- ask your daughter if she uses this service?
- ask your daughter if she has received any abuse on this service?
