A busy end to a busy term once again and one in which Helenswood girls have enjoyed lots of varied opportunities to shine:



- 6th Form students took part in MADE revision training on the Ark William Parker site on Wednesday 24th February 2016.
- The Ark Helenswood Academy debate team celebrated winning the Ark Schools debate competition.
- Year 11 students attended a careers convention organised by the Head Girl Team in association with Future First, the alumni association on Tuesday 8th March 2016. This was an event which also allowed us to mark International Women’s Day – the theme this year of pledging to support women’s aspirations for vibrant and exciting careers was an ideal opportunity to hear more about the working lives and success of ‘old’ Helenswood girls. It was such a pleasure to be able to welcome them home and we look forward to seeing more of them in the future.
- Two students celebrated achieving places in the East Sussex Youth Orchestra this term.
- Year 10 students had the opportunity to listen to a piano recital from one of the competitors from the Hastings International Piano Competition.
- Ark Helenswood students participated in Safer Internet Day 2016 to raise awareness of keeping safe online.
- Lower School students took part in Sports Relief Day on Friday 11th March; walking, running, or crawling over 120 miles around the school site. Each student has been encouraged to raise sponsorship for this event and final funds will be counted on Friday 18th March.
- Year 10 students took part in MADE revision training on Tuesday 15th March 2016.
- 6th Form students carried out their annual Geography Field Trip w.e. Friday 11th March to Swanage.
- The Lower School site and Upper School students hosted and facilitated the Hastings Borough Council Youth Matters Conference on Thursday 17th March. Key discussions centred on how organisations and individuals can work together to help young people overcome barriers to success. What do young people want? What is getting in the way? What gaps are there in existing provision? How these could be filled? An inspirational morning of work from both our young people and community partners.
- Year 7 students had a further opportunity to work alongside alumni in a workshop hosted by Future First on Monday 21st March.
- The annual Helenswood Dance Show took place in the Ark William Parker School Hall on Tuesday 22nd March at 7pm.

- Ms Nieto (Assistant Principal and MFL teacher) will be leaving the academy at the end of Spring 2 following a period of part-time MFL teaching. She is relocating and taking up the post of Head of MFL in another school. She is a truly inspirational teacher and will be very missed by us all.

Ark Helenswood girls' artistic endeavours are forever captured on the pier!



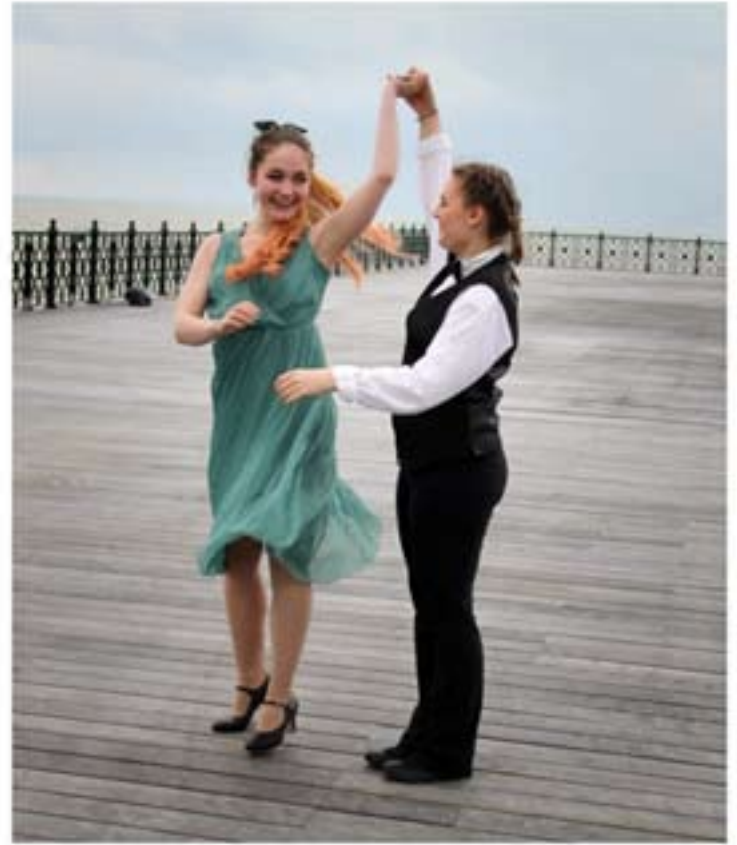

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Year 12 Politics and Sociology students visit the Houses of Parliament

On Monday the 14th of March, Year 12 Politics and Sociology students from Ark 6th Form, East Sussex attended the Houses of Parliament for a trip related to the specific elements of their A-level study. The visit enabled students to observe the inner working of the British Parliament and to see at first-hand concepts discussed in class and how they operate in practice.



James Hamilton, Head of 6th Form and teacher of Government and Politics said "This was a fantastic opportunity for the students at Ark 6th Form to see at first hand the operation of their democracy and to experience a place steeped in political History.

The visit certainly added weight to their educational experience in Government and Politics".



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Year 10 students taking part in the first Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award



Students arrived at Swattington Campsite early on Saturday morning to 're-pack' their rucksacks to include tents, pegs, poles, cooking equipment'It's never all going to fit in' were the cry's' , but with a little brute force and tactical folding, the girls were set for their first day of walking in the Kent country side.

The girls walked the first few Kilometres with Miss Scott and Mr Burchall, giving guidance and navigational instructions. The girls were then asked to follow their pre-planned route cards and maps to the differing checkpoints, navigating foot paths and bridle paths and heaving their heavy rucksacks.

Six hours later, exactly as planned, the girls returned to the campsite and were ready to pitch their tents and begin cooking their evening meal under the stars.

A 6am start on Sunday morning, saw the tents being packed away, rucksacks stuffed and breakfasts of portage and sausage sandwiches being cooked on a frosty grass. The girls were off again, with their rucksacks for another the six hour walk, being met at check points along the way! The looks of relief and delight when the students arrived at the finish point of Bodium Castle on Sunday afternoon were indescribable - home to a warm bath and a roast dinner.

The girls were fantastic, all exhibited excellent teamwork, determination, resilience, technical skills (and only minimal moaning about blisters and aching backs).

The girls are now ready and raring to go for their official expedition assessment in May.

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Ark Hastings pupils catch a glimpse into the future of driverless cars



A group of pupils from Ark Helenswood, Ark William Parker, Ark Little Ridge and Ark Blacklands were treated to an exclusive viewing of a revolutionary driverless car.

The car was unveiled at Amber Rudd's Transport summit for the first -time showing off the next generation of surface transporter vehicles that will be totally controlled electronically - a leading technology to speed travel, reduce carbon emissions and eliminate accidents on the road.

The car was then taken to Ark William Parker school grounds where the children had an opportunity to sit inside the car and hear from Professor Nick Reed, Academy Director from the Transport Research Laboratory, about their research work behind the future of road transport.

This first vehicle - a prototype - is proving the control systems and is being aimed at travelling air crew and personnel as well as passengers around major airports, such as Gatwick. These trials are to test to the limit of safety - so that a driver will no longer be required - so reducing the risks of any form of accidental damage. Once proved on this research vehicle, the control system can be applied to all surface transport - cars, lorries and even buses.

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Year 10 Business Studies students were chosen to take part in the Taylor Wessing insight day in the City of London



Throughout the day students were able to network with a variety of Taylor Wessing employees, across all departments, including, corporate law, ICT and systems, Human Resources, Management, Administration and reprographics. Students worked in small groups with employees, discussing job roles and routes into an international business. Students were given an insightful session on CV writing and what not to do when applying for job roles within a legal / business organisation, delivered by the Human Resource Department.
